



MEMBERS "IN THE NEWS-letter" — ADVENTURES IN THE "KEY OF SEA"

We are following what will be a year-long adventure with PC 2022 John Kukla and Lady Ana Kukla on their Benneteau 473, the KEY OF SEA.

HELLO FROM FLORIDA!

After staying put for almost a month in Annapolis, we pulled up the anchor and started another phase of our trip - making the

passage down to Florida. Against our better judgment, we again have a schedule. This time it is Christmas - our 3 daughters are flying down to Nassau in December to spend Christmas with us. I remember talking with Leonard Garbacz at FYC when we first joined. He was telling us the story of

how they (I think it was a 3 sailboat fleet) went to the Bahamas. Like us, they were going to meet family for Christmas in the

Bahamas. We listened in awe about all the planning and preparation and the adventures along the way. We could never imagine doing such a trip. What stuck in my head was that with all their planning, and leaving months ahead of time, they made it to their destination just 8 hours before the family arrived! Here we are just 6 years later, with the same schedule to meet.

This has been a month of putting miles under the keel. We left Norfolk October 28. The weather was not good to take on Cape Hatteras so we entered the ICW. We made it to

Moorhead City in a couple of days. We wanted to go out to the ocean to make some time, but the weather was not cooperating so we pushed on down the ICW.

After 4 more days of motoring the ICW, we made it to the Little River Inlet in NC. We dropped the anchor an hour before sunset. As we sat in the cockpit checking the weather and watching the setting sun changing the color of the ocean, we looked at each other and said "we should be out there". We double checked the weather

and ourselves, and then pulled anchor and headed out into the ocean minutes before the sunset. The seas were calm, but the promised wind never really arrived with any gusto, so we motor-

sailed the whole time. 23 hrs and 114 miles later we dropped the hook right next to the USS Yorktown in Charleston SC. What a great 1st trip on the "outside", and make some progress south.

After a couple of days in Charleston, it was back on the ICW down to Raccoon Island SC. There we took the opportunity of good weather to jump back out and make some time to Savannah. While it probably wasn't much shorter, it is much nicer to be out in the ocean rather than confined to the narrow (and shallow) ICW. Our 6 ft draft works well to verify the charted shoals. When on the ICW, you really can't ever leave the helm.

Savannah has free city docks right

downtown. There is a 48 hr limit and we used the time to see some of the town and enjoy some low country cooking. Mmm Mmm good!

Next we headed back out and made our longest passage to St. Augustine FL. It was 135 miles in 21 hours. After all that traveling, we were weathered in at St. Augustine for 6 days.

Fortunately the town was a great place to spend time, and we were in Florida!

After 6 days we were anxious to move on, so we took the ICW to Stuart FL. Here we are making some improvements to Key of Sea and provision for our passage to the Bahamas. We are very grateful to Paul Goddard and Marcie Gracey who are letting us use their car. Having ground transportation available is wonderful; we can't thank them enough for their kindness.

CANADA ENTRY: To the best of my knowledge, all one needs to enter Canada is a valid passport, and report in upon landing (at a dock or anchoring). One can also call at CANPASS before landing. ArriveCAN is now for flying only.

CBP ROAM REQUIRED: US requires the use of CBP Roam (no mention of CBP One when I last signed in).

DO YOU HAVE YOUR DTOPS DECAL? Boats of length 30' or more need a DTOPS decal to return to the U.S. This number as well as a Trusted Traveler number (may not be required for boaters) should be entered into CBP Roam as well as passport numbers.

a way that made environmental and economic sense."






