



GET 'ER IN SHIP SHAPE PREPARING FOR SPRING SPLASH

All this past Winter we have been hibernating in our warm homes while our boats shiver out in the cold. Usually at this point in the year the ground is still covered with snow. Not so this year! The sun has already started to peak out from behind the clouds. Each day is getting warmer and longer. I'm not sure about you, but I've been impatiently awaiting the return of warm weather. I've also been researching new gear, reading books/articles/blogs, archiving pictures from last summer, and even made a new playlists of cruising music.

When the forecast says "no more frost", it's time to pull the covers off from our boats. Soon enough, it will be time to start putting our plans for this summer into action.

But before we launch our boats we will need to check, service, and perform maintenance of all critical boat systems. I recommend enlisting the help of your friends, family and fellow sail club members that LOVE to get out on the water with you. Tackle the task as a Team. Then reserve



your day and time for LAUNCH! "Splish-Splash!"

EXTERIOR INSPECTION: Remove all covers. Assess the condition of the exterior top to bottom, stem to stern Stay Connections, Wind Vane, VHF Antennae, Lights. Standing Rigging, Spreaders, Boom, Vang, Running Rigging, Clamps, Deck Cleats, Lifelines, Stanchions, Furler, Winch, Anchor, Sails, and Covers.

Note any leaks, cracks, loose or missing retainers, loose threads or broken stitches. Plan to replace or repair any worn or damaged parts that you find before launching.

Prep & Paint – Repair any gouges, scratches. Rinse and clean the bottom surface. Wash and wax the topside.





INTERIOR INSPECTION: Install Batteries and connect Wiring. Test the bilge pump and close all through-hull fittings. For the engine: check or change fluids and filters, inspect and lubricate the impeller (replace as necessary).

REVIEW ALL REQUIRED SAFETY GEAR: A customized checklist can help you avoid missing any necessary items. I found a couple of useful websites for organizing this task for your reference.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS PROPOSED CHANGES—VOTING OPEN FROM MARCH 1 THROUGH


MARCH 31: Throughout 2022 and 2023 the WSSC Constitution and Bylaw Committee has reviewed and recommended changes to our constitution and bylaws. Together we identified needed updates that will bring our guiding document current with all new needs and regulations. The Constitution and Bylaw committee along with the Past Commodores Committee overwhelmingly agree with all of the updates. We hope you will, too.

On March 1, 2024 all renewed members received an email asking you to review and approve the changes. IT'S CRITICAL THAT YOU VOTE. Please don't assume it will pass so your vote isn't necessary. To the contrary, <u>YOUR VOTE IS MOST</u> CRITICAL.

DEADLINE TO RECEIVE VOTES IS MARCH 31, 2024:

We are required to receive a **MINIMUM of 67%** approval to update our constitution and all within 30 days. Without it, two years of work will be for naught. **SO PLEASE VOTE**. You can vote by simply responding 'yes' or 'no' to cadumke@gmail.com

While all changes are relatively minor, all require your review and approval prior to implementation. Both committees believe the changes make it the very best it can be as of today—but remember, all Constitutions and Bylaws are living documents and will in the future again require change to reflect that current environment.




CHANGES (READERS DIGEST VERSION)



We are following what will be a year-long adventure with PC 2022 John Kukla and Lady Ana Kukla on their Benneteau 473, the KEY OF SEA.

TIME FLIES WHEN YOU'RE **HAVING FUN IN PARADISE!**

Just when the weather is starting to settle down, We are running out of time! Our 90 day permit to be in the Bahamas runs out March 10. We will renew because we are Feb 3—We have some wild weather not ready to head north and we sure don't want to be deported! We have loved every day in this country and are truly enchanted by the



coming our way, it's time to go find protection. Heading to Georgetown, a , fairly large area where we can find anchorages with relatively good protection. The problem is a lot of vessels are already there and lots more going along with us. Hope we can find room!

We have stayed busy this

past month exploring more islands, snorkeling, mingling with other cruisers over sundowners, and lately savoring the lifestyle of the cruisers in Georgetown-Elizabeth Harbor in the Great Exuma Island. This large harbor is between Georgetown on the mainland (Great Exuma Island) and Stocking Island. It offers protection for all wind directions. There are over 400 boats anchored, with room for at least another 200. The night view of all the anchor lights fools you into thinking you are in a city. There are good stores for provisioning, many good restaurants and bars, and hundreds of boaters to swap stories with. This is a cruiser's community with a well organized system to keep everyone informed and engaged. Everyday there is an 8:00 am "Georgetown Cruisers Net" on VHF 72 which provides information for what is happening in the harbor.

There are a lot of activities to keep anyone busy, like beach volleyball, softball, poker and euchre tournaments, bocci ball, yoga, water aerobics, musicians groups, kids activities groups and more—it is like a summer camp. The harbor itself is beautiful, there are many trails to hike on Stocking island, beaches to swim on and reefs to snorkel on. Many

cruisers come here year after year to spend the winter.

AS I WRITE THIS, WE ARE IN THE **MIDDLE OF THE ANNUAL GEORGETOWN CRUISERS REGATTA.**

The regatta goes on for 13 days, with many different contests and activities for all ages. The last couple of days we participated in the big boat races, crewing on Grand Cru, an Island Packet 45, owned by a couple

from Michigan. There are two races, a short in harbor race and a 20 mile around the island. We came in 1st in the long course race, and won 1st overall for our class. We had winds in the 20's with 3 - 6 ft waves in the ocean, which is just what the Island Packet liked. We would have been double reefed on Key of Sea, but Grand Cru just settled in and smoothly cut through the waves.

After spending a couple of days racing on Grand Cru, we have a better appreciation for the IP design. Ana even managed to bake a carrot cake while racing, so we also walked away with a flag and bottle of rum for the "Best Baked Cake while Underway".

Last week we made a 50 nm passage from Georgetown to Rum Cay. It is a nice secluded island with only 45

permanent residents. We met 25% of them at the local sand floor bar. We snorkel on a coral reef and encounter a full size Hammerhead shark, luckily it was not feeding time, but we still got out of the water much quicker than we got in! After that, we sailed another 35 nm to Clarence Town, Long Island and went across the Tropic of Cancer and officially entered the Tropics. Dean's Blue Hole and Hamilton's Cave are two must see spots in Long Island in our book. One evening we were having sundowners on a nice Whitby ketch, and they told us they were heading to the Turks and Caicos. We were only 180 nm away. We almost joined them but after sleeping on it, we decided to save the T&C for next season. I mean really, once you are at the T&C, another 120nm puts

you in the Dominican Republic, and after that Puerto Rico, and on, and on. Way too much to see in the time we have left this season. So, instead of continuing East, we left Clarence Town at sunset and returned to Georgetown by sunrise. It was a wonderful overnight sail, with good winds and a full moon.

Renewing our permit has got us thinking about the future. We are starting to look for a place in the US to keep Key of Sea for hurricane season. We have a long list of good harbors recommended by fellow cruisers. We may keep the boat in Florida because the closer we are to the Bahamas the sooner we can get back here next December. So yes, we will keep on cruising for another year or more. We are hooked on this lifestyle and we don't want to stop yet.
