MEMBERS "IN THE NEWS-letter" — ADVENTURES IN THE "KEY OF SEA"

We are following what will be a year-long adventure with PC 2022 John Kukla and Lady Ana Kukla on their Benneteau 473, the KEY OF SEA.



HAPPY EASTER!

After the busy time in Georgetown, we decided to seek some solitude and charted a course for some less traveled areas. We headed to the Jumentos and Ragged island chain. They are a series of mostly uninhabited cays located in the south central region of

the Bahamas. We saw a way to shave 25 nm off our trip IF we could make it through the Hog Cay cut south of Great Exuma Island. The charts show a 2 nm section with depths of only 0.9 to 1.5 meters. Key of Sea draws 1.8 meters. We saw there was a super high tide forecast for the morning. Even so, it was only a 1 meter rise. Our plan was to arrive at the cut the day before, sound the cut from a dinghy, then pass through the cut at dawn, riding the high tide.

When we got to the cut we found 5 other boats with the same idea. The next morning, with only the pre-dawn twilight, the quiet was broken with the sound of anchors being raised, and as the sun broke the horizon, there was a 6 boat caravan negotiating the cut. We were the last boat, and it was comforting to hear the other boats reporting sufficient depth for us. It was an exciting way to start the day.

We put some miles under the keel, and after an overnight stop at Seal Cay, we anchored in Middle Pen Bay in Hog Cay of the Ragged Island Chain. We were just in time for the annual Valentine's Day Party (this year it was late, in March). This is another "must see" stop, it is beautiful, peaceful, and rustic. There is a small community of cruisers that station there year after year. They maintain several trails, and there is a nice hut for gathering right on the beach known as the "Hog Cay Yacht Club". There are firepits and several tables and chairs for anyone to use. The only nearby village is Duncan Town, and the 60 residents there are very supportive of the cruiser's community.

After Hog Cay, we continued south to Little Ragged Island, which is pretty much the last anchorage in the Ragged Island chain. If we kept heading south 60 nm, we would hit Cuba. We decided that was far enough for our first season and we pointed the bow

After the Raggeds we returned to Long Island via the Comer channel, this time we anchored in Thompson bay on the west side of the island. We were there in time for their annual Mutton Festival. Mutton is the meat of a 2 year old lamb or goat. We often see goats roaming wild so goat meat is a staple in Bahamian cuisine and deserves its own festival with food stands offering mutton cooked in different ways. They had live bands, arts and crafts for sale and plenty of cold Kalik, everyone's favorite beer.

Next on the horizon was a visit to Conception Island, an uninhabited Island which is designated a National Park. It is the home of the long tailed tropicbird, and many sea turtles. There are

beautiful mangrove creeks in the center of the island that are only accessible by dinghy at high tide. Conception is a great spot to get away from it all - no cell service, no development, and all the stars come out at night.

After a few days at Conception, an approaching weather front pushed us to Cat Island. It's hard to find good protection from a westerly blow, but we thought New Bight Bay would be slightly better than Conception. It was a rolly night as the front passed, but we were rewarded with calm

weather and waters the next few days. It is interesting how our tolerance to rolly anchorages has changed, we used to be concerned with a 20 kt blow, now we are able to sleep with 30 kts howling through the rigging. Our ground tackle has proven itself in some heavy seas and blows, and we trust it. Of course, we always have an anchor alarm (or 2) set. If we leave our Starlink internet service on, we can even monitor the anchor alarm remotely with our cell phone apps when we are on land, if there is cell service.

Our plans for the rest of this season are firming up, and once again we have a schedule. Our middle daughter is flying into Georgetown April 7 to spend a week with us. When she leaves, we will take our time and continue north before crossing back to the USA.

We are sorry we will miss Commodore Anita's ball, we are sure it will be a wonderful event and we will be thinking of you on that special day.


Have you seen this flag?


